4-1301.09a (d)(2) concerning instances where Child and Family Services Agency is not required to make reasonable efforts to reunify families (to assess disparate impact on communities of color and potential constitutional implications); and (3) D.C. Municipal Regulations (29 DCMR 6007-6009) concerning kinship licensing regulations (to assess disparate impact of denials on communities of color).
