Description

Protect our Esto'k Gna identity by accessing archeological data on Carrizo Comecrudo Tribe ancestral villages and sacred sites held by federal and state agencies.

The tribe requests support and guidance on how to best acquire archaeological data on the sites (e.g. FOIA requests, litigation, draft policy reports).

US Customs and Border Patrol (CBP) contacted the Tribe in January 2021 and relayed that they had archeological data on 16 village sites that they were going to provide to the Tribe.

CBP never provided the Tribe with that information even after several requests by the Tribe to do so. CBP recently provided data on only 2 sites on federal lands and refuse to provide the Tribe with information on the other sites, which are located on private land, because CBP is no longer planning to build the Wall on these sites.
