Description

Children's Law Center is conducting a 50-state survey on statutes, regulations, policies, and programs related to assistive technology (AT) for students with disabilities. Federal laws including IDEA, the ADA, and the Rehabilitation Act of

1973 place obligations on local education agencies to provide AT, which supports students in activities ranging from communication to mobility. Despite these mandates, many students with disabilities in the District of Columbia—disproportionately Black and Latino students—are systematically deprived of AT supports and services. The survey will catalog relevant legal frameworks and data across all 50 states to identify best practices and gaps in implementation. The findings will inform future litigation and systemic advocacy efforts to improve AT access for students with disabilities.
