Description

NPAP is interested in compiling a list of cities that have successfully adopted and implemented policies and practices that reduce police violence and increase transparency. We are seeking support: (1) identifying cities that have adopted these

policies (via media searches, etc.); (2) accessing and/or requesting copies of the policies; and (3) assisting NPAP staff in analyzing the policies. Below are the issues for which we would like to obtain policies:

- Non-police traffic enforcement
- Non-police crisis intervention teams
- Restrictions stops and arrests for low-level violations
- Requiring officers to document all traffic stops
- Restrictions on vehicular pursuits
- Policy of releasing body worn camera footage of critical incidents
- Policy of releasing officer misconduct records
- Restrictions on no-knock warrants
