Description

The Policing Working Group and the Truth, Hope, & Justice Initiative (THJ) expand its police misconduct database to a new city. Building on the momentum from its work in Chicago and Philadelphia, THJ expands the police misconduct database to NYC. This project offers a NYC firm the opportunity to lead this initiative.

THJ seeks a law firm to assist with creating a police misconduct database for New York City. Law firm resources will be expected to do the following:

- Establish a core team to manage the project, including managing volunteer researchers, training volunteers from multiple firms, and assigning research.
- Compile data set from LFAA-provided sources to prepare volunteer assignments.

- Work closely with Thomson Reuters to create a HighQ survey. LFAA will provide samples of surveys used in Chicago and Philadelphia.
- Conduct quality control on volunteer work and revise the data before publishing it to the database.
