Description

Saul Ewing LLP is supporting a project examining how surveillance and data ecosystems are being used to identify and track individuals seeking abortion care across state lines post Dobbs. The project analyzes how law enforcement and private actors have relied on digital evidence from tools such as automatic license plate readers (ALPRs) and social media platforms in post-Dobbs investigations. The working paper will assess the legal standards governing access to these data sources and identify where existing privacy protections fall short. The research will evaluate downstream risks for patients, providers, and support networks facing surveillance-driven enforcement. The paper will propose concrete strategies to mitigate the use of surveillance technologies in reproductive health enforcement contexts.
